# Purpose.

To minimize the risk of injury or ill health to persons through the correct use and placement of safety signs.

### Scope.

This procedure covers all SES Engineering (Newark) Ltd sites and offices. Appropriate safety signs and signals will be provided and maintained in compliance with relevant Health & Safety and Fire Regulations.

# Responsibilities.

- Management is responsible for ensuring that employees receive suitable and sufficient instruction and training on the meanings of safety signs.
- > Management is responsible for ensuring that safety signs conform to relevant legislation.
- Management is responsible for ensuring that suitable and sufficient signage is available and posted to warn employees and visitors of the hazards and dangers on site and in the offices.
- > Management is responsible for ensuring the maintenance of all safety signage.
- > Employees are responsible for complying with the requirements of any signage posted on site and in the offices.

### Procedure.

- > Risk assessments shall be carried out to determine where safety signs are required.
- > Where the wearing of PPE is mandatory, signs shall be installed to clearly indicate the specific areas of concern.
- > Safety signs shall be posted at all sites and offices to warn persons of the following hazards:
  - 1. Correct traffic routes.
  - 2. No smoking areas.
  - 3. Falling objects.
  - 4. Unauthorised access.
  - 5. High voltage electricity.
  - 6. First aid posts.
  - 7. Fragile roofs.
  - 8. Fire extinguisher type/location.
  - 9. Fork-lift truck operations.
  - 10. Lasers/Radiation.
  - 11. Moving machinery.
  - 12. Flammable substances.

- 13. Ear protection zones.
- 14. Speed limits.
- 15. Hazardous chemicals/substances.
- 16. Visitor reporting area.
- 17. Fire exits.
- 18. Fire assembly points.
- 19. Pedestrian routes.
- 20. Instructions to wear PPE.
- 21. Compressed gases.
- 22. Isolation/Cut-off zones.
- 23. Parking areas.
- 24. Dusk mask zones.

### **NB:** This list is intended for guidance only and not conclusive.

- > All employees shall be trained in the correct identification and meaning of safety signage.
- > Safety signs must be complied with.
- > Safety signs shall be maintained to be clearly visible.
